## COUNSELLOR'S CORNER

Here we are at the beginning of May. Spring is finally here! A time when the sun shines brighter and the warmth slowly takes over the days. A time of change and a time of growth. It would seem the perfect time to introduce you to Carol Dweck's work. In 2006, Dr. Dweck shared her findings with the world in her best selling book, "Mindsets: the new psychology of success". This is truly a great read and is backed by substantial and convincing research. Almost unbelievable.

It would seem that people will adopt one of two mindsets in regards to their abilities and this can make all the difference. Those who take on a *fixed mindset* believe that they are born with certain abilities. They will tend to avoid challenges to protect their perceived weaknesses and they will put forth less effort. On the other hand, those who embrace a *growth mindset* believe that abilities can be developed. Challenges, criticisms, and even mistakes are seen as opportunities to learn and grow. They are far less likely to be discouraged and instead believe that with the greater effort they are more likely to succeed. Too good to be true? Dweck's research has been hailed as powerful and revolutionary, yet, some of us are reluctant to 'give in' to the simplicity of it all. A belief can't change your life. Nothing is for free.

But what if that belief was foundational to the way we viewed ourselves. From athletics to business to education to parenting, Dweck's work on mindsets is changing the landscape of the way people live. For those who embrace the growth mindset, this is not an easy life but they would tell you it's worth it. This mindset asks us to commit to the hard work of fostering positive relationships with adversity and failure. Yet, imagine living free of the pressure of perfection and experiencing intrinsic self-worth based on our courage rather than our continual success. The truth is, life will inevitably offer challenges and adversity. How we interact with this truth can make all the difference. At Westboro, we are talking about growth mindsets. In our staff meetings, in our student circles on Monday mornings, and within our classrooms. It is our hope that by building growth mindsets, our students will not only be better equipped for learning at school but also for living in this everchanging world.

Throughout this year there has been a growing challenge to all of us. To lean into the areas of life that we tend to turn away from. Whether this is work of Dr. Alex Russell with anxiety, Dr. Kelly McGonigal with stress, or Dr. Carol Dweck with failure and setbacks, the challenge is there! Yet, so are the rewards. To grow and succeed in the face of adversity. To be resilient.

Mental Health Awareness Week will run this year from May 7th to May 11th. What an opportunity for us to lean in. To stand with each other and to stand with our kids. To move towards healthier living. The Public Health Agency of Canada defines positive mental health as "the capacity of each and all of us to feel, think and act in ways that enhance our ability to enjoy life and deal with the challenges we face. It is a positive sense of emotional and spiritual well-being that respects the importance of culture, equity, social justice, interconnections and personal dignity". And so, good health to you and all of yours.

#### STUDENT TRANSPORTATION: 2018-19 REGISTRATION IS NOW OPEN

Planning to use Student Transportation in the 2018-19 school year? If so, make sure your child is registered so Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) can plan routes and send your child a bus pass before the first day of school.

All students who indicated needing transportation services through the pre-enrolment process are now registered. Families will receive tentative route schedules and invoices by the end of the month fees are due June 30, 2018.

## LITTLE ELK ISLAND ADVENTURES: REGISTRATION



Elk Island Public Schools is once again running Little Elk Island Adventure, a fun and informative program for *first-time school bus riders*.

Annually, Student Transportation offers the Little Elk Island Adventure to new riders and their parents. The program's aim is to help ease any anxieties a family may have about riding the bus before even starting school. Through a series of activities, riders learn about: school bus safety, danger zones, tips on boarding and how to sit properly on the bus. After that, both the children and parents hop on the bus to practice what they've learned and then venture out on a short ride.
