Search for stored images, videos and internet files:

- o Windows – Search
 - *.htm. *.html for internet files;
 - *.gif *.jpg *.jpeg *.bmp for images
 - *.avi *.mpeg *.mpg for video files
- o Macintosh – Same as above but without the *

Review Your History Files:

- o IE - Click the History button on the toolbar to view the sites your browser has been to recently
- o Netscape – Click Communicator on the toolbar, select Tools and then History. (Ctrl-H).
