WESTBORO TRACK TEAM TRYOUTS

Dear Westoro Parents/ Guardians,

The Westboro School track team tryouts for Grade 4, 5 & 6 students will begin after Fall Break. Please note that speed, work ethic, attitude, participation effort & consistent attendance are all factors that we will consider when we create the teams for the relay races. There will also be alternate spots for races if needed. The students who make the team will participate in the Running Room Indoor Games, preliminary races in February & (if we qualify) the Running Room Indoor Games Finals in March. There is also the Elk Island Invitational Relay Races at the beginning of May.

The Grade 5 & 6 Tryouts are from 7:35-8:20 a.m.: Tuesday, Nov 14th & Thursday, Nov 16th

Grade 4s Tryouts are from 7:35-8:20 a.m.: Wednesday Nov 15 & Friday Nov. 17th

During the Track Try-outs & during regular track practices, the doors open shortly before 7:30 am. Track students are to enter the school at the front door, quickly put their backpacks away, get their running shoes on and bring a labeled waterbottle. The track team members are to wait quietly outside the gym doors for the track coaches. The track team will be running in the gym and the hallways. They will need to wear appropriate sports clothing (T-shirts, shorts, sweatpants, running shoes, deodorant...). There will be just under ten minutes for the students to change, have a quick snack or time of relaxation before classes begin.

Once the Try Outs are completed, the track practices run every Tuesday & Thursday mornings from 7:35-8:20 a.m.

If your child is interested, the permission form must be signed via Permission Click prior to the first tryout date.

Possible fees for the track team:

- Running Room Indoor Games Relay & bus up to a maximum of \$16
- Individual Running Room Indoor Games race up to a maximum of \$10.50
- Track team T-shirts cost is \$30 with the option to borrow one on the day of the race if need be.

If you have submitted a Name Plaque in previous years, the school has kept it and it will be displayed again. If there are any changes (ranking, deployments, etc.) please advise that a replacement form is needed and we would be happy to provide one for you.
- Westboro Family Tribute: If you have a picture of a family member who has served or is currently serving in the Canadian Armed Forces, please send a digital copy to Mrs. Richard (courtney.richard@eips.ca). It does not have to be a picture of your family member in uniform and can be a picture of your family member with your child(ren) who attend Westboro. Along with the picture, please also include in your email: name of the person/people in the picture, rank (for family member served/serving), and relation to your child(ren) who attend Westboro (i.e. grandfather, aunt, brother, great-grandmother, etc.). Please ensure these are sent by Friday, October 27th to allow time to add these to our existing tribute. Like the Wall of Honour, if you need to make any changes to your submission from previous year, please notify Mrs. Richard who would be happy to make modifications as needed.

SCHOOL FEES

School fee information for the 2023–24 school year is now posted on the PowerSchool Parent Portal. All fees are due within 30 days of being posted. To access your fee information, simply log in to the <u>PowerSchool Parent Portal</u> and go to "Student Fees." There you can view your fees and pay them online.

Don't forget to also log in to the PowerSchool Parent Portal regularly throughout the year. Fees are often added to your child's account to cover the cost of various school activities such as field trips, class projects, extracurricular activities fees and more.

If circumstances exist where you're unable to pay your fees, you can apply to have certain <u>fees</u> waived by submitting an <u>Application for a Waiver of Fees</u>. **The application deadline is Dec. 15, 2023.**
