7) Administration Report:

Mike Lastiwka – Principal

- Success with balancing the budget-even with our recent decrease in students.
- French Immersion Programs
- Bev Facey has been recommended to absorb the Jr. and Sr. High French Immersion programs between Sherwood Park, Ardrossan, Fort. Sask, etc
- There are mixed feelings among parents about long distances travelled by school children and by the change in grades that will be pooled together.

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Amberly Witzke - Grade 6

- Recommending individual iPads for students in replacement of Smartboards
- Most smartboards are 20 years old and starting to die
- If they die during a lesson, it affects being able to do lessons in real time
- Smart boards are interactive, but teachers are stationary while using them
- With iPads, you can take pictures at any moment and instantly project work to the smart screen while walking around the room-not restricted to one area
- Teachers can be more in the moment, especially with larger classrooms
- Currently working on iPad app for report cards/students
- Pictures of work and audio recordings will all be saved regarding the outcomes of students, and will follow them through the years to see if they are meeting requirements or struggling "in real time"
- Funds for iPads (assistance with our technology budget) is how parents can support learning in the classroom
- Parent's Society has been asked to provide 50% of budget

Tracey Prouse - Assistant Principal

- Reading week was a huge success
- Many ESL and other kids were "adopted" for the afternoon to read with other families
- Books were even read in English and then in Spanish to remind everyone what it's like to have a language barrier
- Mike Lastiwka and Tracey Prouse have been doing "small groups" with certain grades at a time to allow time for teachers to collaborate
- AMA was able to come discuss Road Safety with Patrollers.
- All EAs to be trained in First Aid working with Brandy Chimko to get all staff first aid trained this year.
- We remain super grateful for our Librarian Mrs. White. She knows books, she knows the kids, and she
 continues to order books that engage the kids in reading. She has been essential to the success of our
 students' learning.
- The division will also be addressing the caliber of school photos taken this year by Lifetouch. We understand many parents are unhappy with this new company.
