

**Activity**: Word chains

## **Description:**

### What is a word chain?

A word chain is a list of words targeting a specific skill. They help students build decoding skills (reading) and encoding skills (spelling) and move in a progression of changing one letter or combination at a time.

#### **Materials:**

# What do I need to get started?

- A word chain
- A letter magnet board or whiteboard and whiteboard marker

#### Instructions:

- 1. Have students build (with manipulative letters or print on a whiteboard) the first word in a word chain.
  - 1. For example: "build the word cat".
- 2. Have students change only the portion of the word needed to create the second word in the word chain.
  - 1. For example: when changing cat to hat, students only change the c for a h, instead of creating a whole new word.
- 3. Alternate how you have students change the word each time.
  - 1. When you ask students to change "cat" to "hat" students are practicing the skill of encoding (spelling).
  - 2. When you ask the students to change the h to a p and read the new word "pat", students are practicing the skill of encoding (reding)
- 4. Continue through the word chain, changing only the portion a word needed each time.
